- :: Present gifts wrapped neatly and elegantly. Red or gold-colored wrapping paper is often preferred.
- :: Never open a gift immediately upon receiving it. It is customary to open gifts privately.
- :: Remember to express gratitude when receiving a gift by saying "thank you" or "do ze" in Cantonese.

Consider Small Apartment Sizes:

- :: Due to limited living spaces in Hong Kong, practical and space-saving gifts are highly appreciated.
- :: Prefer lightweight and compact gifts that are easy to store.
- :: Choose gifts that have multiple uses or can be consumed, such as food, beverages, or perishable items such as flower bouquets.
